

Maths

Objectives to be covered this term

- To know how to count in groups of 10's.
- To know how to count in equal groups of 2, 5 and 10.
- To know sharing as a model of division.
- To know how to describe position, direction and movement including whole, half, quarter and three-quarter turns.
- To know how to count forwards and backwards within 100.
- To know the value of different currency of coins.
- To know how to tell the time to the nearest hour on an analogue clock.
- To know how to find half of a shape.

Ways to help at home

- ◆ Continue practise reading number up to and past 100.
- ◆ Continue to practise writing numbers from 0—50 in numerals and words.
- ◆ Use objects to support with adding, subtracting and dividing.
- ◆ Organise toys or cubes into groups of 2s 5s and 10s.
- ◆ Look at the time on different clocks/ devices to show 24hour and analog times.
- ◆ Find half of different items such as a chocolate bar, pizza an apple. How do we know it is half?
- ◆ Look at money and the different values each coin holds

Key Vocabulary

Our topic for the summer term is 'Into the Jungle'. We will launch the topic by looking at wild plants, garden plants and evergreen trees. We will also be learning about how artists use shape in their work. The children will also be looking at famous people who have contributed to significant achievements from different periods of time such as Charles Darwin and Dr Livingstone. We will be learning key words related to this, so you can help at home by helping your child read and recognise them.

English

Objectives to be covered this term

Writing

- Use phonic knowledge to spell simple words
- Write some common exception words
- Re-read sentences to check they make sense. To know how to form capital letters correctly.
- To know that equal spaces are left between words.
- To know how to write in chronological order

Reading

- Read and understand simple sentences
- Use phonic knowledge to read words accurately
- Read some common irregular words
- Read words with contractions, such as it's and I'm
- Demonstrate understanding when talking with others about what they have read.

Speaking

- To be able to participate in discussion about what is read to them, taking turns and listening to what others say
- Develop own stories and explanations by connecting ideas or events.

To help at home you can look for words children can decode around the environment. You can also involve children in writing cards, lists and notes around the house. At school we talk about recommended reads so encourage your child to say why they would suggest a book to their friends.
