Objectives to be covered this term

- To confidently use written methods for addition, subtraction, multiplication and short division
- To add and subtract fractions with the same denominator
- To be confident in adding and subtracting numbers mentally
- To understand how to check answers using inverse operations
- To be able to recall the 3, 4 and 8 times tables
- To be able to count on in 1's, 10's and 100's
- To be able to partition numbers with 3 digits or more
- To be able to read and write numbers with 3 digits and understand the value of each digit in it.
- To be able to compare and order fractions with the same denominator
- To be able to count in tenths and understand that tenths arise from dividing a whole into 10 equal parts
- To be able to recall number facts mentally to support with mental calculations

<u>Ways to help at home</u>

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- Use TT Rockstars at least 4 times a week for 10 minutes
- ${\ensuremath{\,\bullet\,}}$ Practice telling the time
- Practice addition, subtraction, multiplication and division calculations with large numbers.
- Recall the 2, 5 and 10 times table
- Read and write large numbers together and practice knowing what each digit in the number is
