Notes: Key Question: How is life different for child refugees? - Map analysis, linked to all the tales we study. Map in classroom to discuss places we've visited as a class. - Share key vocab on mapwork - Look at climate zones (and key vocab) - tropical, arid, Mediterranean, mountains, temperate, polar - and why the equator affects this. - Study of a variety of key countries and their cultures each week: a study of Mexico: geographical work on North and South America, Frida Kahlo (linked to art culture), Mexican food and cultural traditions. A study of the continent Asia (linked to Syria and our class read The Boy At The Back of the Class), a study of the seas surrounding this country too. A comparison of capital cities/countries between England and Syria. Explore the refugee crisis (ActionAidUK) and charities to support. A study of Greece, linking to Ancient Greece and their inventions, and also the refugee crisis there too. Exploration of culture and traditions, myths and legends, Gods and Goddesses. - Link to natural disasters of these regions. An exploration of how natural disasters can be detrimental to those living in harsher and poorer conditions, such as those in places of War or poverty. Link to the refugee crisis and how countries come together to support. - Record keeping in sketch books - exploring tabs, textiles, pop-up mechanisms, artist study and studying the difference between copying and interpreting. - Art linked to culture of stories; explore various cultures and their artists/work. - In-depth artist studies will be carried out to gain an understanding of famous figures and their pieces of art, the meaning behind them and why they are admired.
