Objectives to be covered this term

- •To be able to count objects to 20.
- •To be able to compare and order numbers up to 20.
- •To count one more or less from any given number.
- •To understand the place value of one and two digit numbers.
- •To be able to add and subtract numbers, using objects and drawings.
- •To be able to partition numbers using objects.
- •To be able to recognise and name a variety of 2D and 3D shapes.

<u>Ways to help at home</u>

- •Help your child to write numbers to 20 correctly.
- Practise recognising numbers to 100, knowing what each digit in the number is worth.
- Practise addition to 20 and subtraction.

- •Look at 2D and 3D shapes in the shops in real life.

- Develop own stories and explanations by connecting ideas or events.

Ways to help at home

- Read with your child for at least 10 minutes every day and after reading, ask them comprehension questions about what they have read.
- Practise letter formation.
- Retell stories.
- Encourage independent writing / reading at home.
- Write sentences using correct punctuation, including full stops and capital letters.
- Read the weekly email regarding phonics and spelling, and support us by helping your child to learn the new sounds and tricky words.
