




# Home Learning

Subject	Key Learning Objective	Learning Activities and Tasks
Maths	<p>To be able to practise counting forwards from 0 – 20</p> <p>To be able to read and write numbers up to 20, in numerals.</p>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1.) Watch the video below to practise counting forwards to 20: <a href="https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=MVzXKfr6e8">https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=MVzXKfr6e8</a></li> <li>2.) Watch the video numerous times so you can remember all of the numbers, in order.</li> <li>3.) Make some number cards from 0 – 20. You can make these however you like. Practise reading them and put them in order, from smallest to largest. An adult may be able to help you with this. Shuffle regularly to test your knowledge.</li> <li>4.) Next time you go on a family walk, gather some natural resources to help you with your counting. Can you put these in order from smallest to largest? Here's an example:</li> </ol>  <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>5.) Complete the activity attached at the bottom of this document. You could print this, copy the drawings or count from the computer screen. To challenge yourself, add another 4 monkeys. How many do you have now? Take away 13 monkeys. How many do you have left?</li> </ol>
