



Project Planning – Down in the Jungle

Newton – Summer 1

To be able to locate the seven continents and five oceans of the world, using a globe and a world map.

To know the seven continents of the world are: Africa, Antarctica, Asia, Australasia, Europe, North America and South America.

To know the five oceans of the world are: Arctic Ocean, Atlantic Ocean, Indian Ocean, Pacific Ocean, and Indian Ocean.

To be able to locate countries, using a world map, including Russia, Brazil, UK, Egypt, Australia, Greece, Canada, and Thailand.

The children will then use a blank world map to colour code the countries, using a key.

To be able to locate hot and cold areas of the world in relation to the Equator and the North and South Poles, using a world map.

To know Vostok, Antarctica is a cold location (South Pole), Brazil is a hot location, (Equator) and Oymyakon (Russia).

The children will use a blank map to identify three basic climate zones – hot, mild and cold.

To know that pattern (lines, basic shapes, and curves) can create art (can be linked to maths).

To know that pattern can be repeated or placed in a specific way to create art (decreasing/increasing size).

To be able to create artwork using basic shapes, lines and curves.

A pattern art station will be provided within the craft area.

To know that artists use shape to create artwork

To know 2 types of art movement (Modern art and Pop art)

To know that Jackson Pollock is part of the Modern art movement.

To be able to re-create a piece of art in the style of modern art.

To be able to explore and describe the shapes they see in artwork.

To know key information about significant people that are related to the topic 'Down into the Jungle'

The children will learn about the life of Sir David Attenborough and his achievements. They will write a fact file about him.
