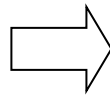
Project Planning – Africa (Summer 2)

Music: To be able to recognise African rhythm and beat; to know an African song.

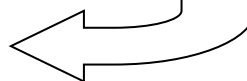


Week 2

Music: To be able to perform an African song and evaluate the performance.

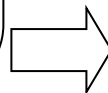


Week 3

Science: To know the impact of diet, exercise, drugs and lifestyle on the human body.

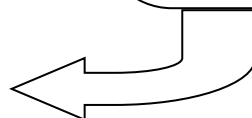


Week 4

Week 5

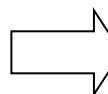
Art (clay week):
