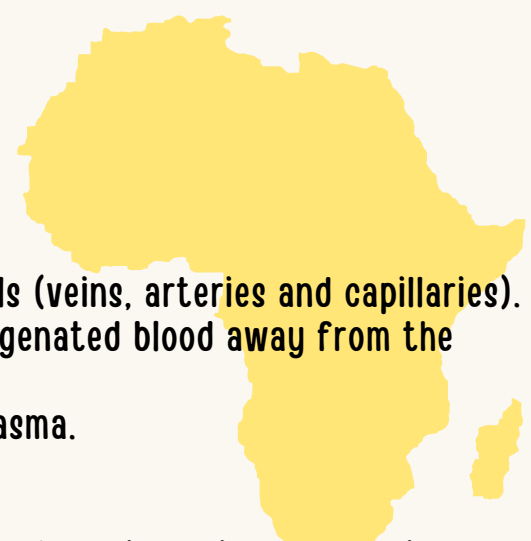


SCIENCE

- Mammals have hearts with 4 chambers.
- The circulatory system consists of the heart, blood and blood vessels (veins, arteries and capillaries).
- Veins carry deoxygenated blood to the heart and arteries carry oxygenated blood away from the heart, to vital organs.
- Blood has four key parts: red and white blood cells, platelets and plasma.
- Diet, exercise and lifestyle all have an impact on the body's health.
- Drugs, smoking and alcohol have a negative impact on the body.
- Nutrients and water are absorbed in the stomach, small intestine and large intestine and carried, by the capillaries, into arteries.

HISTORY

- The Kingdom of Benin began in 900CE and ended in 1897CE.
- We know about Benin through artefacts and objects, oral reports and some written record.
- In 900CE, the Edo people discovered Benin in the rainforest in West Africa. Originally, the Kingdom was called 'Igodomigodo' and ruled by the 'Ogiso'.
- In 1300CE, the Obas ruled the Kingdom of Benin.
- The Kingdom of Benin ended in 1897 due to 6 key factors: the Obas lost control, a civil war broke out, the British were targeted when they visited, the slave trade ended, other countries wanted palm oil and resources, and the Obas began making human sacrifices.
- Benin was heavily involved in the slave trade: they would sell men, women and children to European countries and the Americas.
- Nelson Mandela was an anti-apartheid activist who became the first president of South Africa in 1994-1999.
- Martin Luther King Jr. was an activist for black people's rights, and a key figure in the Civil Rights Movement in 1955.



D&T and COOKING

- Complex structures can be reinforced, stiffened and strengthened using a range of methods, e.g. the cross-hatching strategy when joining clay.
- African foods consist of starchy items, like rice and potatoes, as well as meat, fish and seafood. Other typical ingredients include: dates, goat, lamb, beef, almonds and olives.
- Foods and drinks contain different substances, such as fibre, nutrients and water, which are needed for our health.
