- To be able to compose numbers up to 10 in different ways
- To solve problems by doubling, halving and sharing.
- To know that subtracting makes a number smaller

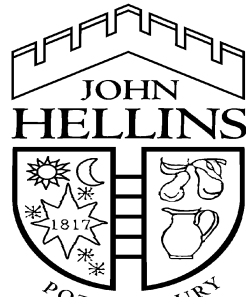
To help at home, you can point our numbers in the environment, count objects, bake together. If you would like a recommended online number site I would copy this link to bbc bitesize

## Project Learning and Vocabulary

Our project for this term is 'Traditional Tales'. We will be reading lots of traditional tales like: Goldilocks and the Three Bears, Jack and the Beanstalk and Little Red Hen with a focus on re-telling the stories. We will begin this topic by reading the story 'The Three Little Pigs' and use puppets to tell the story. We will then look at the alternative story for this called 'The Three Little Wolves and The Big Bad Pig'. Our focus will be, planning and building structures, specifically thinking about how to make it stable, how to fix it together and what will make it better. Key vocabulary choices will include words such as:

## Literacy

Objectives to be covered this term.

- To continue a rhyming string.
- To be able to read simple sentences
- To be able to link sounds to known graphemes and spell words phonetically
- To name and sound the letters of the alphabet.
- To be able to read and write tricky words
- To enjoy an increasing range of books.
- To know a book or Author they like
- To be able to blend longer words
- To re-tell a story in sequence
- To be able to make predictions about a text
- To be able to answer questions related to a text
- To be able to talk about past, present and future events
- To write a series of sentences which can be read by others.
- To be able to orally rehearse a simple sentence before writing
- To be able to form most letters correctly

To help at home you can point out the rhyme in reading books and comment on the spelling of rhyming words. You can look for words and letters children can recognise in their favourite books at home. You can also involve children in writing cards, lists and notes around the house.
