Maths

Objectives to be covered this term

- ♦ Counting objects to 20
- Ordering numbers
- Counting 1 more or less than any number
- ♦ Counting 1:1
- Number bonds—finding 2 numbers that make 10 when added together or 20 numbers that equal 20 when added together
- ♦ Addition
- ♦ Subtraction
- Finding fact families—A fact family is a group of maths facts using the same numbers. For example, 10+2=12, 2+10=12.
- Partitioning—splitting numbers up into tens and ones eg 12 is one ten and two ones
- Recognising 2D and 3D shape and knowing their names and basic properties

Ways to help at home

- ◆ Help your child to write numbers to 20 the correct way around.
- ◆ Practise recognising numbers to 100 knowing what each digit in the number is worth.
- ◆ Practice addition and subtraction using numbers between 1 and 20.
- Notice numbers in the environment encourage your child to read them.
- ◆ Look at 2D and 3D shapes in the shops in real life.

Key Vocabulary

Our topic for the Autumn term is 'Tales from around the World'. We will be looking at some countries where our tales, and stories come from.

We will be finding out about these countries and gathering and developing geographical skills. We will also be using them in class. You can help at home by helping your child to read and recognise them.

Ways to help at home

- Read with your child for at least 10 minutes every day and after reading ask them comprehension questions about what they have read.
- Practice letter formation
- Retell stories
- Encourage independent writing/ reading at home.
- Writing sentences using correct punctuation and practising using colons and semicolons correctly.
