Objectives to be covered this term

To count in steps of 2,3,5 and 0 forwards and backwards.

To be able to count forwards and backwards in tens from any number.

To be able to identify, represent and estimate numbers using different representations, including the number line.

To be able to compare and order numbers up to 100.

To be able to read and write numbers to up to 100 in numerals and words.

To be able to recognise the place value of each digit in a two-digit number (tens and ones).

To be able to add and subtract numbers using concrete objects, pictorial representations and mentally.

To be able to show the addition of two numbers can be done in any order and subtraction of one number from another cannot.

To be able to recognise and use the inverse relationship between addition and subtraction.

To be able to solve problems involving addition and subtraction.

To be able to recognise and use symbols for pounds and pence.

To be able to find different combinations of coins that equal the same amount of money.

To be able to add and subtract amounts of money, including giving change.

Ways to help at home

- Read and write numbers in numerals and words.

- Add and subtract numbers using items from around the home, such as toys, pieces of Lego or colouring pencils.

- Become increasingly familiar with money coins and notes.

- Understand the place value of numbers.

Our topic for the Autumn term is 'Tales from around the World'. Objectives to be covered this term

English

To be able to use familiar and new punctuation correctly, including capital letters, full stops, commas, question marks and exclamation marks.

To be able to write sentences with different forms: statement, question, exclamation and demand.

To be able to write expanded noun phrases to describe and specify.

To be able to write about real events, poetry and different purposes.

To be able to use spacing between words.

To be able to write capital letters and digits of the correct size.

Reading

To be able to apply phonics knowledge and skills to decode words.

To be able to read accurately by blending sounds.

To be able to read words containing suffixes.

To be able to read most words accurately and fluently.

To be able to read the Year 2 common exception words.

Ways to help at home

- Read at home for ten minutes each day and ask your child questions about what they have read.

- Read for pleasure.

- Practise writing sentences using capital letters and full stops.

- Practise writing letters of the correct size and formation.

- Write stories or information based on real events.
