Objectives to be covered this term:

- To use written methods for addition, subtraction, multiplication and division.
- To be able to add, subtract, multiply and divide fractions.
- To know how to calculate the % of a number.
- To know square numbers up to 12 x 12.
- To be able to calculate with negative numbers.
- To be able to partition a number up to 1 million.
- To be able to read and write numbers up to 1,000,000 and understand the value of each digit in it.
- To be able to round a number to the nearest 10, 20, 50 and also to 1 decimal place.
- To be able to calculate the factors of a number and the highest common factor.
- To be able to calculate if numbers are multiples of each other by knowing rules and techniques.

Ways to help at home

- Use TT Rockstars at least 4 times a week for 10 minutes.
- Practice telling the time.
- Practice addition, subtraction, multiplication and division calculations with large numbers.
- ♦ Learn square numbers off by heart.
- Read and write large numbers together and practice knowing what each digit in the number is.
