Objectives to be covered this term

- To be able to count objects to 20.
- To be able to compare and order numbers up to 20.
- To count one more or less from any given number.
- To understand the place value of one and two digit numbers.
- To be able to add and subtract numbers, using objects and drawings.
- To be able to partition numbers using objects.
- To be able to recognise and name a variety of 2D and 3D shapes.

Ways to help at home

- Help your child to write numbers to 20 the correct way around.
- Practise recognising numbers to 100 knowing what each digit in the number is worth.
- Practice addition to 20 and subtraction.
- Notice numbers in the environment, encouraging your child to read them, eg door numbers or rod signs.
- Sing counting songs.

Key Vocabulary

Our topic for the Autumn term is 'It's a Celebration'. We will launch the topic by making our own lemonade, (in relation to our first text 'When Grandma Gives You a Lemon Tree'). We will be learning about animals and will be writing fact files about elephants and identify and name common animals that are carnivores, herbivores and omnivores. We will be learning key words related to this, so you can help at home by helping your child to read and recognise

them.
