Objectives to be covered this term

- To confidently use written methods for addition, subtraction, multiplication, short division and long division.
- To add and subtract fractions with the same denominator.
- To be confident in adding and subtracting numbers mentally.
- To be able to check answers using inverse operation.
- To be able to recall the 3, 4 and 8 times tables.
- To be able to count in 1's, 10's, and 100's.
- To be able to partition numbers with 3 digits or more.
- To be able to read and write numbers with 3 digits and understand the value of each digit in it.
- To be able to compare and order fractions with the same denominator
- To be able to count in tenths and understand that tenths arise from dividing a whole number into 10 equal parts.
- To be able to recall number facts mentally to support with mental calculations.

Ways to help at home

- Use TT Rockstars at least 4 times a week for 10 minutes.
- Practise addition, subtraction, multiplication and division calculations with large numbers.
- Learn the 2, 5 and 10 times tables
- Read and write large numbers together and practise knowing what each digit in the number is.
- Log on to Century and complete Maths nuggets.

Ways to help at home
